

80999 is an SMS service for deaf people and speech impaired people.

An emergency is when ...

- There is a danger to life or risk of injury being caused, such as a serious road accident or assault.
- A crime is in progress, such as a robbery, burglary, criminal damage or theft, and the offender is still on the scene or has just left the area.
- The immediate attendance of a police officer is necessary - such as someone acting suspiciously or about to commit a crime.

When texting the Emergency Controller, REMEMBER to provide:

What? What the problem is.

Which? Which emergency service you require
- Police / Fire / Ambulance / Coastguard / Rescue.

Where? Where the emergency is. Give name of road and town and any other information like house number; or outside Post Office; or near Bus Station.

IMPORTANT: Also try other ways to contact the emergency services. Text messages are not guaranteed to arrive quickly. We rely on the mobile phone companies and the network. We cannot be held responsible for delays in receiving messages. You will know your message has been received **ONLY** when you get a reply. Until you get a reply, try other ways to contact the emergency services.

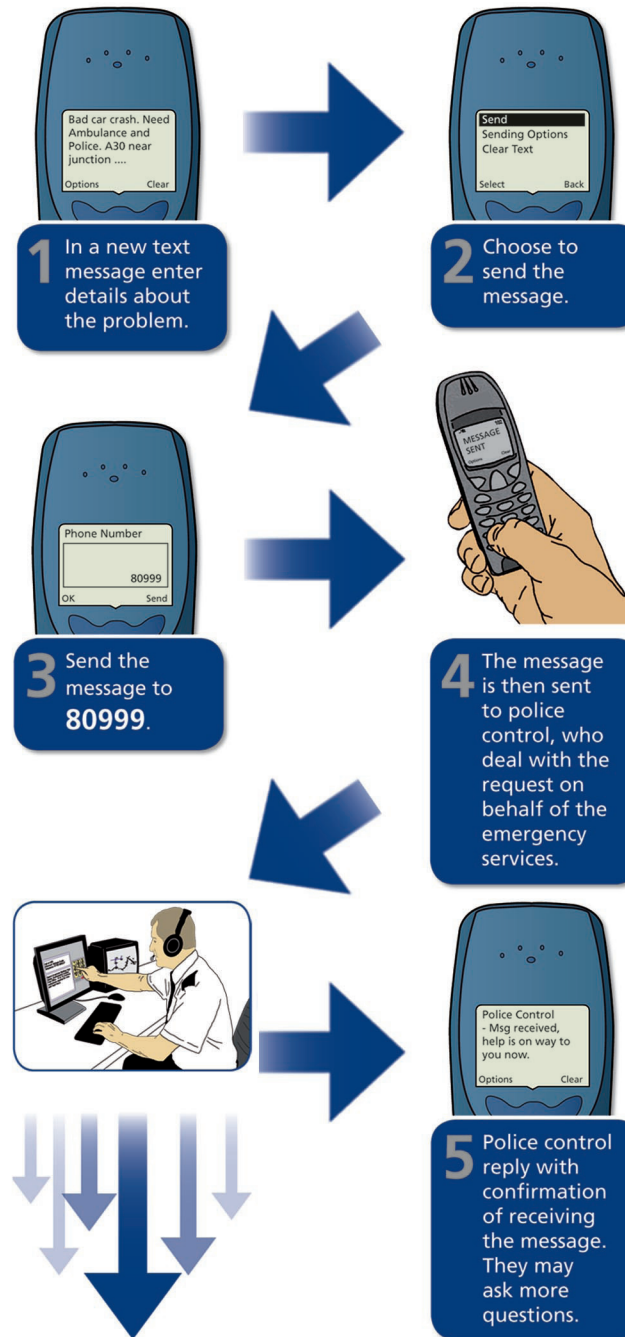
