1. Universal Credit

The introduction of a new single benefit, called Universal Credit, which will replace all means tested benefits

Who is affected?	Working Age Households claiming means tested
	benefits, including Child and Working Tax Credits

When? From Oct 2013 (all claimants transferred by Oct 2017)

How? One payment of benefits monthly to one member of the household - claims will be made online, with support available for those who need help

> Rent will no longer be paid direct to a landlord but direct to you - you will have to budget your rent, bills and spending every month

Rent is a priority debt and non-payment can result in eviction

What can I do? Talk to landlord to discuss your options



If you haven't got a bank account, it's a good idea to get one - you can set up a direct debit to your landlord

2. Cap on Benefits

A cap on the total benefits paid to out of work households based on the average wage of in work households

Who is affected?	Working Age Households claiming Jobseekers
	Allowance or Income Support or Employment Support
	Allowance and Housing Benefit, Child Benefit, Child
	Tax Credits, Carers Allowance and a number of other
	benefits

When? Summer 2013

How?Initially the cap will affect your Housing Benefit and
will then affect your Universal Credit

- £500 per week for a couple or lone parent
- £350 per week for a single person

What can I do?Look out for letters from Wiltshire Council and the
Department for Work and Pensions

3. Under Occupancy (Bedroom tax)

If you are living in social housing that is bigger than you need from April 2013, your Housing Benefit entitlement will be restricted

Who is affected?	Working Age Households living in social housing that
	is considered to be too large for their needs

When? April 2013

How?Reduction in Housing Benefit of 14% for 1 extra room
and 25% for 2 or more extra rooms

- One room for each adult over 16 years, or couple
- Children under 16 years, same gender, expected to share
- Children under 10 years, different gender, expected to share
- Only exemption is for a registered overnight carer

What can I do?

Talk to landlord to discuss your options

4. Non-dependant deductions

If you live with people who are over 18 and not in education - who are working or claiming benefit, deductions will be taken from your Housing Benefit

Who is affected?	Working Age Households claiming Housing Benefit with people over 18 and not in education
When?	Now
How?	Deductions will be taken from your housing benefit
	£12.40 per week to £80 a week depending on levels of earning
What can I do?	If someone over the age of 18 lives with you, and they are not your partner, contact Wiltshire Council to check

you are claiming the right amount of Housing Benefit

5. Personal Independence Payment

Disability Living Allowance will be replaced by the Personal Independence Payment (PIP) and be based on medical assessment

Who is affected? People currently claiming Disability Living Allowance

- When? From June 2013 for new claims From October 2013 for existing claims
- How? The new system will be focussed on how your condition affects you

It is expected that 20% of people will lose their award

What can I do? Look out for a letter from Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) asking you to attend a face-to-face medical assessment

6. Council Tax Reduction

Council Tax Benefits will be replaced by a local

Wiltshire scheme

Who is affe	cted? Working Age Households currently receiving Council Tax Benefit
When?	April 2013
How?	Households will be expected to pay at least 20% of their council tax, regardless of their income
	 Exemption for people claiming disability premiums
	 Exemption for people claiming war disablement pension or war widow/widower pension
	Council Tax is a priority debt and non-payment can result in imprisonment
What can I do?	do? Look out for your council tax bill

7. Welfare Assistance (Social Fund)

Community Care Grants and Crisis Loans will be replaced by a local Wiltshire scheme called Local Welfare Provision

Who is affected? People in crisis, in urgent need of goods or services

When? April 2013

How? Wiltshire Council have designed their own scheme and criteria

It focuses on providing vouchers and pre-payments for people in need

What can I do?If in urgent need, apply to Wiltshire Council for
assistance or contact Wiltshire Citizens Advice
